GLUTEN GLUT

Pros & Cons of adding too much wheat grain in diet.

Gluten is not glamorous. It is invisible to the naked eye, being found in the endosperm of grains of wheat, rye, barley, oats and all their processed derivatives. Ironically, its absence would be noticed immediately: this humble protein constituent lends the flours of these grains their strength, texture, elasticity and lightness.

The most common way we ingest gluten in India is through atta (a strong wheat flour that retains the grain's germ, endosperm and bran) and maida (wheat flour stripped down whiteness). Whether used unleavened (roti, chapatti, puri) or leavened (naan, breads, cakes), the gluten content of wheat flour decides how the final product tastes. The more the batter or dough is mixed or kneaded, the more the molecules absorb

water (or other liquids), cross-link with each other and pull and stretch into flexible strands. Introduced to heat on the tawa or in the oven. gluten expands, capturing the carbon dioxide released during the kneading and/or leavening process and leading to the creation of a light phulka, an airy croissant or a melt-in-the-mouth

sponge cake. Once the gluten is consumed, it triggers a whole set of reactions determined by the particular genetic make-up of a person. "About one- third of Indians have the type of HLA [human leukocyte antigen] pattern that potentially makes them allergic to gluten," says Dr Ramakrishna, who redflagged the damage potential of gluten intolerance in India with a paper in the Indian Journal of Medical Research in January 2011.

"However, very few of these people will ever develop coeliac disease. One factor may be the total amount of gluten they eat daily. And there are almost certainly other genetic factors that may decide whether or not the individual is susceptible to coeliac disease. The occurrence of coeliac disease corresponds to the amount of wheat consumed in the diet. So, currently, the incidence of the disease in northern India — where wheat is the

mainstay of the diet - is estimated at around 1% of the population. It is thought to be far less in rice-eating eastern and southern India.

The ABC of Coeliac - Coeliac disease is a chronic digestive disorder: as little as 10 mg of gluten can trigger an immune reaction that attacks the small intestine, causing both stomach distress and nutritional deficiencies. Recent research, however, indicates that "coeliac disease is a multi-system disorder... highly variable in its clinical expression, may occur at any age and may present with a variety of manifestations." Apart from the gastrointestinal effects, it may express itself as iron deficiency, fatigue, osteoporosis, delayed puberty, infertility, canker sores, depression and epilepsy - and this is not even an exhaustive list.

> The Alternatives - A growing number of urban Indians are dropping wheat from their diet by choice to avoid suffering from bloating, gas problems, wheezing, diarrhoea and lack of appetite. Those who have a regular north Indian diet of rotis and parathas, have now

switched to rotis and breads made with amaranth and millet flours, besides rice, usually red rice. "The impact has been immense stomach feels lighter, no more bloating, gas, colds or wheezing.

Gluten-abstaining individuals could actually acquire a nutritional advantage by including indigenous and oftenignored grains such as millets (ragi, bajra), amaranth (ramdana) and brown rice, which have exceptional quantities of protein, calcium, iron and fibre. Rice, wild rice, corn, maize, corn meal, sorghum, jowar, chestnut flour (Singhara), Quinoa, pearl millet (bajra), finger millet (ragi), buckwheat (kuttu), Amaranth (ramdana) & sago (Sabudana). By including these grains we can avoid the digestion problems.

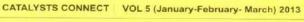

SETTING HEALTHY WORKPLACE BOUNDARIES

Professional boundaries are important because they define the limits and responsibilities of the people with whom you interact in the workplace. When workplace boundaries are clearly defined, the organization works more efficiently because redundant work assignments are eliminated and task performance is accountable. When everyone in an organization is made aware who is responsible for what, healthier workplace environments are created. It then becomes very difficult for someone to blame others for their failed or inadequate performance and good job performance can clearly be identified.

Establishing and Maintaining Boundaries

An individual's professional boundaries can be defined in terms of a job description, as long as it clearly outlines basic responsibilities and reporting relationships.

Your professional boundaries become more clearly defined when you can answer all of these questions:

- Who gives you your assignments?
- To whom do you report?
- Who gives you feedback?
- Who sets your work priorities?
- How are your company and client personal information kept secure?
- Do you know how to treat all staff members fairly without positive or negative feelings influencing your decisions?

A smooth functioning organization is a tangible demonstration of their team leader's commitment to their success, which creates trust in leadership. It is the responsibility of every team leader to set the tone of the group by clearly defining acceptable and unacceptable workplace behaviour. In some cases boundaries need to be firm. For example, lying, stealing, or verbally or physically abusing others is never allowed.

Another important area that should be negotiated is interpersonal boundaries, because professional and interpersonal boundaries substantially impact workplace

productivity and the quality of social environment. Interpersonal boundary parameters include:

- The tone people use with each other.
- The attitude and approach co-workers use with each other.
- The ability to focus on work objectives even with people you doesn't like or with whom you are having personal conflict.
- The ability to effectively set limits with others who have poor boundaries.
- Clearly defining the consequences when a boundary is violated and sticking to it.

Boundaries will have no meaning if your actions don't back up your words.

Where to Start

Ideally, workplace boundaries are carefully negotiated in an open discussion about responsibilities, goals, and priorities prior to starting a new job or beginning a project.

Here are three core skill areas to help you get started:

- 1. Know your limits: what you can do well within the allotted time frame : Give accurate estimates. Delivering a good product on time will improve your credibility, while missing deadlines or delivering a substandard product will only hurt your reputation.
- 2. Tactfully and openly communicate about goals and limitations: Keep your focus on your positive intentions; ask for help when it's needed to ensure good quality work; actively engage in problem solving, and don't complain about the problem.
- 3. Be available to discuss differences and reach agreements : Reflect back your understanding of the other person's needs, interests, and concerns. Attempt to negotiate win-win solutions.

Establishing boundaries and priorities go hand in hand because they both help manage interpersonal relationships in the workplace. Together they go a long way toward establishing productive work environments based on trust.

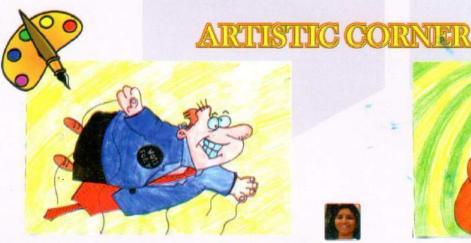

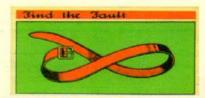
